PREAMBLE

These Rules and Regulations for The Club at Brasada Ranch (the "Club") are intended to be a guide to the use of the Club Facilities referenced in the Membership Plan. They are not intended to deal with all conceivable issues that may be presented for governance. These Rules and Regulations are established by the Club to protect the facilities available for use by members, their family and Member Guests (as defined herein)("Club Facilities") and to promote the health, safety, welfare and enjoyment of the members, their families and Member Guests and all other persons using the Club Facilities. The Club is committed to providing all members and their Member Guests with an enjoyable club experience. To uphold these standards, members and Member Guests are expected to act in a manner consistent with good taste. The Club may amend these Rules and Regulations from time to time as it determines appropriate in its sole discretion. Where these Rules and Regulations refer to the Club taking action or having certain rights, Brasada Club LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (the "Company"), doing business as the Club, shall have the right to take such action and shall have such rights. All capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Membership Plan.

GENERAL CLUB RULES

1. Members, their families and their Member Guests shall abide by all rules and regulations of the Club as they may be amended from time to time.
2. The Club Facilities shall be open on the days and during the hours as may be established by the Club. Areas of the Club may also be closed for scheduled maintenance and repairs. The Club reserves the right to close portions of the Club Facilities to hold events and tournaments, from time to time, as more particularly described in the section of the Membership Plan titled "Promotional Use."
3. Alcoholic beverages will not be served or sold, nor permitted to be consumed, at the Club in any manner prohibited by law. The Club reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to refuse service to a member or Member Guest when that member or Member Guest appears to be intoxicated.
4. All food and beverages consumed on the Club Facilities must be furnished by the Club unless otherwise permitted.
5. Employees are permitted to deliver food or alcoholic beverages to locations away from the immediate area of the clubhouse or other designated areas of the Club Facilities only with the permission of the Club.
6. Commercial advertisements shall not be posted or circulated at the Club nor shall solicitations of any kind be made on the Club Facilities or upon the Club's stationery without the prior approval of the Club. Other than as permitted in writing by the Club, no petition shall be originated, solicited, circulated or posted on Club property.
7. Members shall not use the roster or list of members for solicitation or commercial purposes.
8. It is contrary to the Club's policy to have its facilities used for functions or fund raising efforts for the benefit of a political cause, except as specifically permitted by the Club.
9. The Club Facilities shall not be used in connection with organized religious services or other activities except as may be approved by the Club.

10. Members should not request special personal services from employees of the Club who are on duty or the personal use of the Club's furnishings or equipment which are not ordinarily available for use by members.

11. Dogs or other pets (with the exception of those assisting persons with disabilities) are not permitted on the Club Facilities, except with the permission of the Club. Where dogs are permitted on the grounds, they must be on a leash. Members are responsible for damage caused by an animal owned by the member or under the member's control.

12. All complaints, criticisms or suggestions of any kind relating to any of the operations of the Club or its employees must be in writing, signed and addressed to the Club Manager.

13. Members and their guests may not abuse any of the Club's employees, verbally or otherwise. All service employees are under the supervision of the Club Manager and no member or Member Guest shall reprimand or discipline any employee, nor shall a member request an employee to leave the Club Facilities for any reason. Any employee not rendering courteous and prompt service should be reported to the management immediately.

14. Self parking is permitted in areas identified as such. No parking will be allowed on grassed areas. "No Parking" signs must be observed. Violators may be towed at the owner's expense.

15. Smoking is permitted only in designated areas. Cigar and pipe smoking is not permitted in the dining and lounge areas, except the lounges adjacent to the men's and women's locker rooms.

16. Absolutely no fireworks are permitted anywhere on the Club property or adjacent areas unless part of a fireworks exhibit organized and conducted by the Club.

17. Firearms and all other weapons of any kind are not permitted on the Club property at any time.

18. Use of the Club Facilities may be restricted or reserved from time to time by the Club.

19. Violation of any of these rules or conduct in a manner prejudicial to the best interests of the Club will subject the person in violation to disciplinary action by the Club in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.

20. The personnel of the Club will have full authority to enforce these Rules and Regulations and any infractions will be reported to management.

21. In no event shall the Club discriminate against any individual because of the individual's race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, handicap or marital status.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS

1. The Club may issue a Membership Card to the member and the member's immediate family, as defined in the Membership Plan. Membership Cards will only be issued upon payment of dues by the member. Membership Cards will not be issued to children under the age of 12 or over the age of 22. If the Club issues Membership Cards to members and family members, members and their families must have their Membership Card with them at all times while using the Club Facilities. Membership Cards will not be transferable. In order to protect members from improper charges, the Club may require Membership Cards, if issued, to be presented at the point of sale for all transactions.

2. Membership Cards, if issued, will be mailed to the members at the address designated by the member or held for pick-up at the Membership Office as determined by the Club.

3. In the event of a lost or stolen Membership Card, the Club must be notified immediately. The member's account will be canceled and the Club will issue a new Membership Card number. Until notification of Membership Card loss or theft is received in writing by the Club, the member shall be responsible for all charges placed on the account. A Membership Card replacement fee as determined by the Club may be charged for lost or stolen Membership Cards or in any situation where the account number is changed.

4. Each member may receive such identification decals and other insignia as the Club may from time to time designate, and shall display such insignia as required by the Club.

MEMBER DUES AND CHARGES

1. Members' dues will be billed on a monthly basis unless otherwise determined by the Club.

2. Members shall provide the Club with one credit card to which the member authorizes the Club to charge dues, fees and charges which become delinquent and the member shall substitute such credit card with another credit card when it expires. The member will then be entitled to credit and charge privileges at the Club so long as his or her membership is in good standing. Cash payments will be permitted unless otherwise determined by the Club from time to time.

3. Members have the option of having dues, fees and other charges billed to their credit card on file with the Club, or billed directly to their club account, as provided for in the Membership Agreement. Such charges will be billed on a monthly basis and members will receive a written statement of their charges. All members agree to pay directly to the Club any amounts not paid by the credit card company within ten days of receipt of written notice from the Club.

4. Club accounts shall be deemed delinquent from the date first billed if payment is not received within 30 days after the date of the monthly statement. Past due bills will be subject to a one and one-half percent (1.5%) late payment charge per month, but not to exceed the maximum amount permitted by law. The late payment charge shall accrue 30 days from the date of the monthly statement until the account is paid in full. Members having past due bills may be charged a reinstatement fee at the discretion of the Club to reactivate an account once it is deemed delinquent.

5. If a member fails to pay any club account within 30 days of when it is first billed, the Club shall have the right to suspend membership privileges in the Club at any time until the delinquent account is paid in full. Continued delinquency for a period of 90 days from the date a club account is first billed or repeated incidents of delinquency by a member may result in termination of membership in the Club. Additionally, the Club shall have the right to downgrade a Golf Member's membership to an Athletic Membership as provided in the "Discipline" section hereinafter.

6. When a membership is issued in the name of an entity, each designated user of that entity shall be jointly and severally liable for all dues, fees and other charges and liabilities associated with the membership.

7. If the account of any member is delinquent, the Club may at its option take whatever action it deems necessary to effect collection. If the Club commences any legal action to collect any amount owed by any member or to enforce any other liability of any member to the Club, and if judgment

is obtained by the Club, the member shall also be liable for all costs and expenses of such legal action and reasonable attorneys' fees, including any fees required in connection with appellate proceedings.

MAILING ADDRESSES

1. Each member shall be responsible for filing with the Membership Office, in writing, preferably on a form provided by the Club, his or her mailing address and any changes thereto, where the member wishes all notices and invoices to be sent. A member shall be deemed to have received mailings from the Club 10 days after they have been mailed to the address on file with the Club. In the absence of an address on file at the Membership Office, any mailing may, with the same effect described above, be addressed as the Club Manager may think is most likely to cause its prompt delivery.

2. The Club must be notified in writing of any change of address. Failure to do so shall constitute a waiver of the right to receive notices, bulletins and any other communications, and a violation of these Rules and Regulations.

MEMBERSHIP CORRESPONDENCE

Complaints or suggestions concerning the management, service or operation of the Club should be in writing, signed by the member and addressed to the Club Manager. Errors in billing charges should be directed to the attention of the Accounting Personnel.

CLUB SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES

1. The Club provides a variety of social, cultural and recreational events in which all members are encouraged to participate.

2. The Clubhouse location is a popular venue for wedding receptions, parties and business meetings. Members are requested to make reservations with the appropriate Club personnel for available dates and arrangements.

3. The Club desires to encourage the use of the Club Facilities by members for private functions on any day or evening, provided it does not interfere with the normal operation of the Club Facilities, or with the services regularly available to members.

4. Private functions are permitted at the Club Facilities only with prior permission of the Club. The individual member sponsoring the function shall assume full responsibility for the conduct of Member Guests and the removal of any decor. The member sponsoring the function shall be responsible for any damage to the Club Facilities and for the payment of any charges not paid by individuals attending the private function.

5. Special events and functions may be scheduled from time to time at the discretion of the Club.

RESIGNATION OF MEMBERSHIP

1. A member may resign membership in the Club by delivering written notice of resignation to the Membership Office. A membership shall be deemed to have been resigned as of the date the Club receives written notice of the member's resignation. Property owners in the Brasada Ranch residential community ("Brasada Ranch") are not permitted to resign except with the sale of their residence or homesite in Brasada Ranch ("Property") as more particularly described in the Membership Plan.

2. A member who owns Property shall continue to pay dues and may not resign from the Club until the subsequent purchaser of the member's Property acquires a membership in the Club.

3. Notwithstanding any resignation, the member and his or her spouse shall remain liable for any amounts unpaid on the member's account.

DISCIPLINE

1. Members are responsible for their own conduct and for the conduct of their family members and Member Guests. Any member whose conduct or whose family's or Member Guest's conduct shall be deemed by the Club to be likely to endanger the welfare, safety, harmony or good reputation of the Club or its members or is otherwise improper, may be reprimanded, fined, suspended or expelled from the Club and have all privileges associated with the membership suspended or terminated by the Club. The Club shall be the sole judge of what constitutes improper conduct, but improper conduct will include, without limitation: (i) failure to meet eligibility for membership, (ii) submitting false information on the application for membership, (iii) allowing his or her Membership Card to be used by another person, (iv) failing to pay any amount owed to the Club in a proper and timely manner, (v) failing to abide by the rules and regulations as set forth herein and as established by the Club from time to time, (vi) abusing Club personnel or employees, or (vii) acting in a manner incompatible with the standard of conduct of the existing membership or which would likely injure the reputation of the members or the Club.

2. Any member accused of improper conduct shall be notified of the Club's proposed disciplinary action and shall be given an opportunity to be heard by the Club to show cause why he or she should not be disciplined. If such member desires to be heard, the Club shall set a time and date (not less than 10 days thereafter) for a hearing. While such complaint is being considered by the Club, the member shall enjoy the privileges of membership. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Club may, without notice and without a hearing, immediately suspend some or all privileges associated with a membership and/or, after notice, terminate a member for failure to pay in a proper and timely manner dues, fees or any other amounts owed to the Club.

3. The Club may restrict or suspend some or all of a member's, family member's and/or Member Guest's privileges. No member may on account of any restriction or suspension be entitled to any refund of any membership deposit, dues or any other fees. During the restriction or suspension, dues and other charges shall continue to accrue and shall be paid in full prior to reinstatement as a member in good standing.

4. In the case of a Golf Member whose club account is delinquent, in addition to restricting or suspending some or all of a member's, family member's and/or Member Guest's privileges, the Club can unilaterally downgrade the member to an Athletic Membership, in which case all Golf Membership privileges will thereafter be terminated. Should such a downgrading occur, the Club will give notice of such fact to the member. In the case where the member has paid a membership deposit for the Golf Membership, the Golf Membership will be placed on the resigned resale wait list for reissuance in accordance with the Membership Plan, and upon reissuance of the membership, the member will be entitled to a refund of the membership deposit paid for the Golf Membership, less the amount of the membership deposit required to be paid for an Athletic Membership at the time of the downgrade, and less any delinquent amounts owed to the Club by the member. In the case of a Golf Member for whom the membership deposit was waived, the member shall be obligated to pay to the Club the membership deposit required for an Athletic Membership at the time of the downgrade. The downgraded member shall also continue to be obligated to pay to the Club all outstanding amounts owed on the member's club account.

5. Any membership which has been terminated hereunder shall be treated as a resigned membership and the membership deposit, if any, shall be returned to the member in the same manner as in the case of any other resigned membership of similar type.

LOSS OR DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY OR INSTANCES OF PERSONAL INJURY

1. Each member as a condition of membership and each Member Guest as a condition of invitation to the Club Facilities assume sole responsibility for his or her property. The Club shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to any private property used or stored on the Club Facilities, whether in lockers or elsewhere. Any such personal property which may have been left in or on the facilities for six months or more without payment of storage thereon may be sold by the Club, with or without notice, at a public or private sale, or may be otherwise disposed of, and the proceeds, if any, may be retained by the Club.

2. No person shall remove from the room in which it is placed or from the Club's premises any property or furniture belonging to the Club without proper written authorization. Every member shall be liable for any property damage caused by the member, any Member Guest or any family member. The cost of such damage shall be charged to the responsible member's account.

3. Any member, family member, Member Guest or other person who, in any manner, makes use of or accepts the use of any apparatus, appliance, facility, privilege or service whatsoever owned, leased or operated by the Club, including without limitation, the use of golf carts or pool facilities, or who engages in any contest, game, function, exercise, competition or other activity operated, organized, arranged or sponsored by the Club, either on or off the Club's premises, shall do so at his or her own risk. The member and his or her family members and Member Guests assume all risks and responsibilities associated with use of the Club Facilities or otherwise associated with membership, including without limitation, all risks of bodily injury or damage to property (even if such bodily injury or damage to property is due to the negligence of one or more of the Indemnified Parties referred to below). The member and his or her family members and Member Guests release and shall hold the Company and its owners, subsidiaries, affiliates, successors and assigns and related companies and their respective shareholders, partners, directors, officers, members, employees, representatives, agents and members of the Club's advisory board or committees (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") harmless, from and with respect to, any and all loss, cost, claim, injury, damage or liability sustained or incurred by him or her, resulting therefrom, arising out of or incident to membership in the Club and/or from any act or omission of any of the Indemnified Parties. Any member shall have, owe and perform the same obligation to the Indemnified Parties hereunder in respect to any such loss, cost, claim, injury, damage or liability sustained or incurred by any Member Guest or family member.

4. Should any party bound by these Rules and Regulations bring suit against any of the Indemnified Parties in connection with any event operated, organized, arranged or sponsored by the Club or on any other claim or matter in connection with membership in the Club, and fail to obtain judgment therein against any one or more of them, said party shall be liable to the prevailing Indemnified Parties for all costs and expenses incurred by them in the defense of such suit, including court costs and attorneys' fees and expenses through all appellate proceedings.

RESERVATIONS AND CANCELLATIONS

1. During operational periods for the Clubhouse, dining reservations may be required as determined by the Club. Members are asked to assist in maintaining required service levels by making reservations for dining prior to 5:00 p.m. on the day involved. Reservations for parties of more than ten

persons will be accommodated on an "as available" basis. A 24 hour notice is requested for parties of more than ten persons and a set menu should be arranged whenever possible. The courtesy of providing notice of necessary changes or cancellations is requested no later than 3:00 p.m. on the day involved.

2. Reservations are required for most activities and shall be accepted on a first- come, first-served basis by pre-registering with the appropriate personnel.

3. For all functions held in the dining rooms, tables will be assigned on a first-call, first-choice basis. Reservations for special tables will not be accepted.

4. Reservations for dining will be held for only 15 minutes after the reserved time.

5. No member or committee shall plan or set dates for dining room activities without prior approval of the Club.

GRATUITIES

1. For the convenience of all members, a gratuity percentage, as determined from time to time by the Club, may be added to all food and beverage sales. A member may increase or decrease the gratuity percentage by signing the ticket invoice and changing the amount of the gratuity as the member deems appropriate.

2. Cash tipping is discouraged. It is customary for the Club to send a letter providing an opportunity for members to contribute a suggested contribution to a Holiday Fund for all Club employees. Payment of such contribution will be voluntary and will be included on the contributing member's November bill. This Holiday Fund provides the members with an opportunity to show their appreciation to Club employees during the holiday season. Club management shall be responsible for the distribution of these funds.

CHILDREN

1. Unless permitted by the Club, children under 12 years of age are not allowed at the Club Facilities unless accompanied and supervised by an adult.

2. Children under the lawful drinking age are not permitted in any lounge unless accompanied by an adult.

3. Members are responsible for the conduct and safety of their children when at the Club Facilities.

ATTIRE

1. It is expected that members will choose to dress in a fashion befitting the surroundings and atmosphere provided in the setting of the Club. It is also expected that members will advise their Member Guests of the dress requirements. The Club may publish dress requirements from time to time.

2. Gentlemen and ladies are requested to dress in a fashion compatible with the appropriate occasion.

3. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times when on Club Facilities, other than at the swimming facilities.

MEMBER GUEST PRIVILEGES

Guest privileges may be extended under the rules established by the Club from time to time to guest of Club members ("Member Guests"). Member Guests will be entitled to use the Club Facilities only in accordance with the privileges of the membership of the sponsoring member upon payment of daily fees. Although it is the intention of the Club to accommodate Member Guests without inconvenience to the members, the Club reserves the right to limit the number of Member Guests that are sponsored by a member on any given day. The Club shall establish from time to time the rate of the daily Member Guest fees, charges and the rules and regulations for use of the Club Facilities by Member Guests. Member Guest privileges may be denied, withdrawn or revoked at any time for reasons considered sufficient by the Club, in its sole and absolute discretion. The Club reserves the right, from time to time, to limit the availability of golf starting times for Member Guests. Member Guests do not include Rental Guests, Owner Guests or Lodging Guests as defined in the Membership Plan.

MEMBER GUESTS

1. A particular person may use the Club Facilities as a Member Guest a maximum of six times each membership year and only once a month during the months of June through September, regardless of the sponsoring member.
2. All Member Guests must be accompanied by the sponsoring member while using the Club Facilities unless the Club determines otherwise.
3. A particular individual using the Club Facilities as a Member Guest must be registered by the sponsoring member with the Club. The Club reserves the right to require identification by each Member Guest. Member Guests will be charged Member Guest fees for use of the Club Facilities as determined from time to time by the Club.
4. Member Guest charges for any services not paid for in cash will be charged against the sponsoring members' account.
5. Member Guest privileges may be limited by the Club, from time to time, in the sole and absolute discretion of the Club. Notice of such limitation will be given by the Club.
6. The sponsoring member shall be responsible for all charges incurred by the Member Guest. The sponsoring member is also responsible for the conduct of a Member Guest while at the Club Facilities. If the manner, deportment or appearance of any Member Guest is deemed to be unsatisfactory, the sponsoring member shall, at the request of the Club, cause such Member Guest to leave the premises.
7. The Club reserves the right to issue long-term Member Guest privileges in its sole and absolute discretion which may allow long-term Member Guests to use the Club Facilities unaccompanied by the member in accordance with the rules and regulations the Club adopts from time to time.

GENERAL GOLF RULES

1. To better control golf play during prime-time periods, the Club may designate "Primary Playing Times" from time to time when only Golf Members and their spouse or significant other may play golf. Members of the Golf Member's immediate family will have the same golf privileges as the member during all times other than Primary Playing Times.

2. The Rules of Golf as adopted by the USGA together with the Rules of Etiquette as adopted by the USGA shall be the rules of the Club, except when in conflict with local rules or with any of the rules herein.

3. "Cutting-in" is not permitted at any time. All players must check in with the starter. Under no circumstances are players permitted to start play from residences.

4. Practice is not allowed on the golf course. The practice facilities should be used for all practice.

5. Speed of play will be strictly enforced. If a foursome or other group of players fails to keep their place on the course and falls behind the preceding group by more than one hole, the group must allow the following group to play through. Do the same when you stop to search for a lost ball. No more than five minutes should be used to search for lost balls.

6. All players who stop after playing nine holes for any reason must occupy the next tee before the following players arrive at the tee or they shall lose their position on the golf course and must get permission from the starter to resume play.

7. All tournament play must be approved in advance by the Golf Professional.

8. Enter and leave bunkers at the nearest level point to the green and smooth sand over with a rake upon leaving.

9. Repair all ball marks on the green.

10. Repair all divots.

11. Ball hawking is not allowed on the course at any time.

12. If a player is repeatedly warned for slow play, the Club may take such action as it deems appropriate, including without limitation, restricting the person's use of the golf course during certain times of the day.

13. Each player must have his or her own set of golf clubs.

14. Range balls are not allowed to be used on the course.

15. Proper golf attire is required for all players. A description of "proper attire" shall be posted prominently in the men's and women's locker rooms from time to time. Members are expected to insure that their family members and Member Guests adhere to such rules. Denim is not appropriate.

16. Improperly dressed golfers shall be asked to change before playing. If you are in doubt concerning your attire, please check with the pro shop before starting play.

17. If lightning is in the area, all play shall cease.

18. Jogging, bicycling, fishing or recreational walking is not permitted on the golf course at any time.

19. No beverage coolers are permitted on the course unless provided by the Club.

20. "Discontinued Play" Policy: less than three holes played - full eighteen hole credit; less than twelve holes played - nine hole credit.

21. Twosomes may play at the discretion of the pro shop. **Twosomes should not expect to play through foursomes and should not exert any pressure on the groups ahead. Foursomes shall have the right of way.**

22. Twosomes and singles shall be grouped with other players, if available, at the discretion of the pro shop.

23. Singles shall have **no priority** on the golf course and shall be permitted to play only at the discretion of the pro shop. Twosomes and singles are not allowed to tee off on the back nine without express approval of the pro shop management.

24. Groups of five or more players shall only be permitted on the golf course with the permission of the pro shop.

HOURS OF PLAY

The hours of play and pro shop hours shall be posted in the pro shop. The pro shop shall determine when the golf course is fit for play.

REGISTRATION

1. All members and Member Guests must register in the pro shop before beginning play and all members shall present their Membership Cards at registration.

2. Failure to check in and register ten minutes prior to a reserved starting time may result in assignment of another starting time or cancellation, at the discretion of the starter.

PRACTICE RANGE

1. The practice range is open during normal operating hours as posted in the pro shop. The practice range may be closed for general maintenance at the Club's discretion.

2. Range balls are for use on the practice range and may not be used on the golf course.

3. Golf carts are not permitted on any tee area. Parking of golf carts is only allowed in designated areas.

4. Balls must be hit from designated areas. No hitting is permitted from the rough or sides of the practice range.

5. Proper golf attire is required at all times on the practice range.

6. Lessons by unauthorized professionals are prohibited.

GENERAL GOLF CART RULES

1. Golf carts shall not be used by a member or Member Guest on the Club Facilities without proper assignment and registration in the pro shop.

2. Golf carts may only be used on the golf course when the course is open for play.
3. Each operator of a golf cart must be at least 18 years of age and have a valid automobile driver's license.
4. Only two persons and two sets of golf clubs are permitted per golf cart.
5. Pull carts are permitted.
6. Obey all golf cart traffic signs.
7. Always use golf cart paths where provided.
8. Be careful to avoid soft areas on fairways, especially after rains. Use roughs whenever possible.
9. Never drive a golf cart through a hazard.
10. Operation of a golf cart is at the risk of the operator. Cost of repair to a golf cart which is damaged by the member or a family member shall be charged to the member, or in the case of damage by a Member Guest, to the sponsoring member. Each member shall be held fully responsible for any and all damages, including damages to the golf cart, that are caused by the misuse of the golf cart by the member, his or her family members or Member Guests, and shall reimburse the Club and/or any operator of the Club for any and all damages the Club may sustain by reason of misuse.
11. Each member accepts and assumes all responsibility for liability connected with operation of the golf cart. The member also expressly indemnifies and agrees to hold harmless the Indemnified Parties from any and all damages, whether direct or consequential, arising from or related to the member's, his or her family members' or Member Guests' use and operation of the golf cart.
12. "Course closed" or "hole closed" signs are to be adhered to without exception.
13. Violations of the golf cart rules may result in loss of golf cart privileges and/or playing privileges.
14. Golf carts must stay off roadways and out of natural areas.

HANDICAPS

1. Handicaps are computed under the supervision of the pro shop in accordance with the current USGA Handicap System.
2. All members and their Member Guests with a USGA approved handicap may participate in Club tournaments. All handicaps submitted may be reviewed by the pro shop.
3. Members are responsible for turning in all their scores on a daily basis. Any member failing to turn in a score shall result in a score being posted that is equal to their lowest score on record. The pro shop shall assist any members needing help with the posting procedures.
4. Accurate records are to be kept of scores turned in and recorded for all full rounds played. The pro shop shall determine if there are violations by members in turning in their scores.

GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

1. Persons using the golf course should do their part to make a round of golf a pleasant experience for everyone at the Club. Here are some suggestions:

a. Do not waste time. Anticipate the club or clubs you may need, and go directly to your ball. Always be near your ball to play promptly when it is your turn. If a player is delayed in making his shot, it would be courteous for such player to indicate to another player to play which should not be deemed playing out of turn.

b. The time required to "hole-out" on and around the green is a chief cause of slow play. Study and clear the line of your putt while others are doing the same. Be ready to putt when it is your turn.

c. Be sociable, but reserve your extended conversations for the 19th hole.

d. When approaching a green, park your golf cart on the cart path on the best direct line to the next tee. This can save significant time. Never leave the golf cart in front of the green where you will have to go back and get it while the following players wait for you to get out of the way.

e. When play of a hole is completed, leave the green promptly and proceed to the next tee without delay. Do the scoring for the completed hole while the others in your group are playing from the next tee.

f. If you are not holding your place on the course (see General Golf Rules), allow the players behind to play through. Do the same if you stop to search for a lost ball.

g. The golf marshals will report slow play and all breaches of golf etiquette to the pro shop, which will take the appropriate action.

h. Please arrive at least ten minutes prior to your tee time to check in at the pro shop.

GENERAL POOL RULES

1. Use of the pools at any time is at the swimmer's own risk. Any injuries or accidents should be reported to the attendant immediately.

2. Everyone wishing to use the pool facilities must first register and present their Membership Card before entering the pools. Members must register their Member Guests and are responsible for the payment of any appropriate charges as the Club may determine from time to time.

3. Children 11 years and younger must be accompanied by an adult, unless further restricted by state law.

4. Children who cannot swim must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times while in any of the pool areas.

5. Children must be three years of age and toilet trained to use the pools. Children wearing diapers are not permitted in the pools.

6. Swimming is permitted only during designated hours. The pools are officially closed when a "CLOSED" sign is posted.
7. Showers are required before entering a pool.
8. Bottles, glass objects, drinking glasses and sharp objects are not permitted in the pool area. Trash should be placed in the containers located throughout the pool areas.
9. Food is allowed only in designated areas of the pool facilities.
10. All swimmers must wear bona fide swimming attire. Cut-offs and dungarees are not considered appropriate swimwear. Proper non-swim attire is required at all times in the clubhouse and Athletic Club, other than in the locker rooms. Shoes or other foot coverings and caftans or shirts must be worn outside the swimming pool areas.
11. Radios, televisions and the like may be listened to if played at a sound level which is not offensive to other members and Member Guests.
12. Animals, bicycles, skateboards, play balls of any type and coolers are restricted from the pool areas.
13. Lifesaving and pool cleaning equipment should be used only for the purposes intended.
14. Running, ball playing and hazardous activity are not permitted in the pool areas. Pushing, dunking and dangerous games are prohibited.
15. Diving is not permitted unless otherwise indicated at a pool.
16. Fishing, spear fishing and snorkeling equipment, other than a mask and snorkel, are not to be used in the pool areas except as part of an organized course of instruction.
17. Throwing footballs, frisbees, tennis balls, or other objects, spitting or spouting water, and tag games are not allowed in the pool areas. The pool staff has the authority to expel from the pool areas anyone who fails to cooperate in following these Pool Rules or whose conduct is otherwise unbecoming of a member.
18. Swimming parties may be arranged through the Club in advance of the occasion.
19. All persons using pool furniture are required to cover the furniture with a towel when using suntan oils and lotions. The use of these oils and lotions could stain or damage the furniture.
20. All persons using the pool areas are urged to cooperate in keeping the area clean by properly disposing of towels, cans, cups, etc.
21. Smoking is not permitted anywhere in the pool areas.
22. Flotation devices are permitted for non-swimming children up to five years of age. Small toys such as balls, water guns, rings, etc., may be permitted, depending on the number of persons in the pool and the manner in which the toys are used. Tire inner tubes are not permitted. Air mattresses may be permitted, depending on the size of the mattress and the number of persons in the pool.

23. Persons who leave the pool area for over 30 minutes must relinquish lounges and chairs by removing all towels and personal belongings. Saving chairs for persons absent from the pool area is prohibited.

ATHLETIC CENTER RULES

1. Regular operating hours for the Athletic Center will be posted by the Club and may be changed from time to time.

2. A health questionnaire must be completed and signed before using the health/fitness facility. No physician or nurse will be on duty.

3. Prior to use of the Athletic Center, a member and any Member Guests will be required to sign a waiver of liability agreeing to hold the Indemnified Parties harmless from any and all injuries sustained from the use of the facility.

4. All members and Member Guests must sign in at the front desk with their Membership Card.

5. Member Guest fees may be charged for use of the Athletic Center. If fees are established, the member's club account will be billed. See sections regarding Member Guest Privileges for more information on Member Guest access and fees.

6. Any member or Member Guest with health or physical problems should first consult his or her physician before using any of the health and fitness facilities and notify staff upon entrance to the facility.

7. All weights and pieces of equipment must be returned to their proper places at the completion of use.

8. Casual workout attire is acceptable at the Athletic Center such as tee-shirts, tank tops, gym shorts or warm-up pants for men; and leotards, tights, tee-shirts, tank tops, gym shorts or warm-up pants for women. No black-soled (running type) shoes shall be permitted on court surfaces at the Athletic Club. Only aerobic or court shoes may be worn.

9. Pregnant women should not use those health and fitness facilities that would elevate their core body temperature.

10. Smoking and alcoholic beverages are prohibited at the Athletic Center. No food or drink may be brought onto the premises.

11. It is the responsibility of all persons to obtain instruction on how to use the equipment prior to usage of such equipment, and the equipment is only to be used in accordance with such instructions.

12. It is the responsibility of all persons using the Athletic Center to consult with their physician, and such person should be in good physical condition and have no physical, medical or psychological conditions, disabilities, impairments or ailments, chronic or otherwise, which would preclude, impair or prevent him from using the Athletic Center, or engaging in active or passive exercise.

13. Members, family members and Member Guests assume full risk of loss and responsibility for damage to their health.
14. No clothing or personal articles may be stored under benches or in the common areas.
15. Children under 15 years of age are not permitted to use the Athletic Center unless accompanied or supervised by an adult.
16. Horseplay, profanity, disruptive conduct and indiscreet behavior at the Athletic Center are strictly prohibited.
17. Stereo, television and music players should not be turned up so loud as to disturb fellow members. Cell phones should be turned to "silent" while in the Athletic Center. Cell phone conversations should be held outside the facility.
18. All jewelry must be removed prior to exercising.

STEAM RULES

1. Consult your physician before using the steam treatment rooms. These treatments produce moist heat and generally reach temperatures above 105 degrees. It is not advisable to remain in the treatment rooms for more than five minutes at any one time. Pregnant women should not use the steam or other facilities that would elevate the core body temperature.
2. Never use a steam treatment room when you are under the influence of alcohol or narcotics, or when you have taken antihistamines, tranquilizers, vasoconstrictors, vasodilators or stimulants.
3. Never go into a steam treatment room on a full stomach. Wait two hours after a heavy meal before using a steam treatment.
4. Following a strenuous exercise period, **DO NOT GO DIRECTLY INTO A STEAM TREATMENT ROOM.** Rest and cool down; allow your pulse to return as close as possible to your resting rate before entering either facility.
5. For sanitary reasons, no shaving or paper cups are permitted in a steam treatment room.

EQUESTRIAN RULES

Equestrian Members and other members using the equestrian center and facilities are obligated to comply with the separate Equestrian Rules and Regulations, as they may be amended from time to time, by the Club in its sole and absolute discretion.
